Washington county advisory committee of the Camp Fire girls met at the Forest Grange public library Tuesday afternoon. Final plans were made for the Camp Fire girls' camp at Adahi. The committee is deeply grateful for the generous help given by the Hillsboro and Forest Grove people and for their cooperation in making the Camp Fire girls' camp more comfortable than ever.

Camp Fire girls wishing to register for camp are requested to do so as soon as possible in order that arrangements may be made to take care of the number wishing to attend. At present 35 girls can be cared for at one time. If more than that number register, it will be necessary to arrange for two five-day periods of camp. Expense for the five days, including all camp materials and instruction in the various crafts, is \$175.

The staff of counselors for Adahi is selected with care, not only for their particular knowledge of camp activities but for their responsibility, personality and deep interest in the children. Counselors sleep in cabins with the campers and take part with them in all activities.

A bulletin giving full instructions about all that is necessary for a camper to do will be published and given to each Camp Fire girl who registers.

Representatives were also present from Marion, Yamhill, Clackamas counties, Dr. R. C. Matson of Portland and Dr. Bellinger of Salem, tuberculosis specialists, attended and took an active part in the sessions. Mrs. Sadie Orr, daughter of Portland, national president of Federated Women's clubs, with headquarters in Washington, D. C., was one of the principal speakers at the convention. Mrs. Danbar has been active in tuberculosis work in Oregon for years.

The importance of mail sale of Christmas seals was stressed by national speakers, according to Mrs. Abendroth, and this plan will probably be tried here this year.

Two of the outstanding papers read and discussed were "Community Aspects of the Rehabilitation of Tuberculosis Patients," and "Industrial Aspects of the Rehabilitation Problem," said Mrs. Abendroth. Danger of tuberculosis in transients was also stressed, it being reported that one family had thumbed their way from Missouri to Los Angeles to get into the General T. B. hospital at that place.

Specialists were present from practically all states of the union, Porto Rico and Hawaii.
