

Colgate Professor Scheduled for Sunday Sermon

Dr. Edward G. Olsen, former Hillsboro boy who is now chairman of the department of education at Colgate University, Hamilton, New York, and who is spending his vacation here, will give the Sunday evening sermon at 7:45 in the Methodist church, speaking on "Youth Looks at the Church."

Dr. Olsen, who was born in Portland, graduated from Hillsboro schools and completed his college work at Pacific university. He then received a master of arts degree from Columbia University in New York, took his bachelor of divinity degree from the Union Theological Seminary, and received a doctor of education degree from Columbia. During his graduate work period he was associate director of the reconciliation trips in New York city, which were non-commercial, educational group visits to various social areas. He held a research fellowship at the University of Toledo for a year, and for the past three years has been at Colgate.

He is the son of Mrs. Harvey B. Huff of Hillsboro, and is spending the summer visiting here. He plans to leave September 1 and will return east via the Canadian Pacific. Dr. Olsen is the author of numerous articles and book reviews which have appeared in various professional journals, and is now working on a series of pamphlets dealing with various social-economic problems.

Dr. Olsen's wife, Faith Elliott Olsen, will be soloist at the Sunday evening service.
