

Summer Recreation Project is Started Here for Children of Hillsboro Schools

Playground Activities Are Held at David Hill School

By the time this notice is in the hands of the public, there will have been launched in Hillsboro at the David Hill site, a summer recreation project for children ages five to fourteen. Some uncertainty about the project has been dispelled by the announcement of the project.

This project is being sponsored by District No. 7, under the supervision of J. W. Poynter, with the actual work being carried on by Kenneth Hamm and such assistants as yet to be sent to the project by Superintendent Kraus who supervises recreation projects in this county. How many assistants will be required cannot be ascertained until the registration takes place and the number of children to be served is known.

David Hill has been selected as the place to carry on the project for several reasons. The grounds are large and there are trees to give some protection from the afternoon sun which may prove to be troublesome before the summer is over. Toilets, drinking fountains, and play space indoors on rainy days can be had there without the entire building being thrown open to the promiscuous rambling of children or others.

Summer playgrounds are becoming more popular every year. Recent statistics show some four million children in the U. S. who are participating in such projects. It is considered just as important for children's summer recreation as it is for the school year. Many children in any community are not members of regularly organized and supervised programs such as are offered by scouting, 4-H and the many others. If a well organized and supervised program is good for some boys and girls more of it ought to be made available for others.

The opportunity for children to have wholesome play under direction ought to be particularly welcomed by homes where both parents find it necessary to work for the family support. These parents find themselves handicapped and the summer playground is one solution to their problems.

It is to be hoped that all children who have not registered for the playground and who wish to, will see Mr. Hamm at the David Hill building at their earliest opportunity.

The play-day begins at 9 and closes at 4 with an hour or more of time taken out at noon. We can't give out as much information concerning the summer's schedule at this time as we would like to and can only say that it is our desire to get the project organized as quickly as we can and hope to operate it as efficiently as we can. We have the promises of Mr. Grimm, our area recreation supervisor, that his office stands ready to give us all the help that is in his command.
