Dehydration of Oregon grown corn has been proved by experimental work to be a money-saving enterprise, says Everett Davis, extension agricultural engineer at O. S. C. Oregon at the present time imports most of its corn. Transportation charges averaging \$10 per ton. Experimental results indicate that locally grown corn can be dried at a cost of only \$4 or \$5 per ton.
