

Defense Costs Added to Jury's Property Price

Closing the records on the colorful highway condemnation suit which was tried in circuit court here two weeks ago, a final judgment and an order allowing defense trial costs against the plaintiff were signed and filed this week by Circuit Judge R. Frank Peters.

To the jury's price of \$26,900 set for seven parcels of highway right-of-way land in Oregon City, the final judgment adds defendant's trial costs of \$677.60, making a total of \$27,577.60 which the state highway department will pay for the property.
