V. jamboree when the two teams meet again tomorrow night (Friday) on the Hilhi Maple. With the opening whistle set for 7:30 o'clock the game will open T. Y. V. schedules for both squads.

Coach Reece Hathhorn was grooming his court warriors meanwhile in arts of basketball which did not show to advantage in the jamboree. Individual shortcomings were pointed out by the Spartan mentor as the championship-defending team was being put through their paces in regular drill sessions this week.

Other than Clyde White, forward, who has been nursing a cut hand, all the first string men will likely see action in the first T. Y. V. contest. Coach Hathhorn predicted the same evening hills court contests between Beaverton and Forest Grove and between Newberg and Tigard.

### Hilhi, Tigard, Grove Teams Win in Opener

Including Hillsboro, three hoop teams representing the Western half of the T. Y. V. league defeated Eastern teams, 38-20, in the season-opening basketball jamboree at Newberg Friday. Played before a crowd of 800 persons, the triple-header maple event marked inauguration for the gymnasium of Newberg's new \$250,000 high school.

Sharing the West's victory honors with Hillsboro were the Forest Grove Vikings and Beaverton Beavers. Sherwood, Tigard and Newberg represented the East.

Hap Hathhorn's defending champions took a decisive 14-7 win over Sherwood in the evening's feature fray. With a tight man-to-man defense holding the Sherwoodites at bay, the Hilhi five built up an 11 to 4 advantage during the first eight-minute period and coasted to an easy victory. Bill Leader, townering center, chalked up six tallies for the title of high-point man.

Tigard cagers fought to give the East teams an edge but succeeded in building only a one-point victory margin over Beaverton. The final score being 9 to 8. Lots of action as well as many missed tries at the bucket marked the final game in which the Grovemen whipped Newberg, 14-4, to landside the Eastern victory.
