

Annual County-wide Music Festival to Be April 26

Programs to Be Prepared by Sixteen Community Centers

Suggested programs for participation of all county grade schools in the annual Washington county music festival, set for Friday, April 26, were mailed out this week to the more than 100 districts, it was announced Tuesday by O. B. Kraus, superintendent of schools.

Sixteen centrally located communities have been suggested as possible locations for programs of participating groups of school children and parents. Kraus said. They are Hillsboro, Forest Grove, Beaverton, Tigard, St. John, Placerville, Banks, Gaston, North Plains, Timber, Laurel, Garden Home, Cornelius, Reedville, Dilley and Gales Creek.

Variety Sought

The program would include vocal solos and chorus numbers, instrumental solos and duets, band and orchestra music, mass sings with audiences joining in, and specialty musical numbers. All church schools are being invited to take part in programs located at community centers nearest to their respective buildings.

New evidence and a grand jury investigation into the highway death of Melvin C. Teschner, 22, of Aloha, has cleared Francis C. Rigert, 24, Beaverton route 1, of responsibility in the fatality. It was disclosed here Saturday by District Attorney G. Russell Morgan following adjournment of the jury's regular March session.

Rolex P. Prillaman, Aloha, was arrested and booked at the sheriff's office here, meanwhile, on a charge of failing to stop at the scene of the accident where Teschner met his death. The charge is virtually "hit and run," according to District Attorney Morgan, who said that it is now definitely established that Rigert's vehicle came upon the accident victim after he had already been struck to the pavement. Prillaman has been released on \$1000 bail.

Five true bills, one of them secret, were filed by the grand jury. Two indictments name Percy Foreman, 43, Hillsboro route 1, who was arrested by county and state officials Friday. He faces a statutory charge. Bail has been set at \$2000.

Alton Hurst, 29, and Logan Moad, 45, both of Hillsboro, are jointly charged with burglary of the Farmers Union warehouse in the third true bill.
