

Officers Elected At Annual Meet Of Stockholders

Officers and directors of the Tualatin Valley and Sherwood farm loan associations were elected Saturday at a meeting of stockholders held in the county courthouse.

J. H. Imbrie was named for a three-year term as director of the Tualatin Valley association. Other directors are D. G. Lilly, serving a two-year term; Charles J. Herb, one year; and M. N. Simon, one year. Board members named on the Sherwood board were W. W. Shaffer and William Heater, each for term of three years. Other directors of the Sherwood association are Emory Gilmore, two years; Mary E. Chapman, one year; and Louis J. Johnson, one year.

Lilly Re-elected
Board of the Tualatin association re-elected D. G. Lilly as president, J. H. Busch, vice president, and A. S. Stook, secretary-treasurer.

The Tualatin Valley association, which makes and sells Federal Land bank loans in Washington county, was formed last year through the consolidation of Forest Grove and Washington county associations.

In a talk to the membership, Secretary-Treasurer A. S. Stook said: "At the end of 1939 the Tualatin Valley association had 527 members with outstanding land bank loans of \$1,692,400. The Sherwood association had 58 members with outstanding land bank loans of \$151,000."

The Hillsboro office also services 420 land bank loan borrowers amounting to \$664,558. The association together with 227 other associations in Montana, Idaho, Washington and Oregon is a stockholder in the Federal Land bank of Spokane. Stock ownership of the associations approximates \$6,000,000.

Ragsdale Speaks
William Ragsdale, director of the farm credit board of Spokane, and Willard S. Bartlett, assistant district manager for Oregon, reported that in 1939 land bank borrowers in the four states reduced their indebtedness to the bank nearly 24 million dollars.

The bank, Mr. Bartlett said, ended 1939 in the strongest position in its 23-year history. During the year, it added \$1,200,000 to its legal reserves, retired one million dollars of stock owned by the United States government, retired all of its short term notes in the amount of two million dollars and called \$300,000 of outstanding bonds. Its real estate sales were more than \$3,000,000.

Exceeded by more than \$2,000,000 the value of property acquired by the bank during the year. One-third of all land sales were made to tenants who are establishing themselves on farms of their own.

Sales Estimated
Pile, representing feed dealers, estimated that a total of \$248,000 of grain and hay was marketed in Hillsboro during the past year. This figure, he said, represents sales of 800 tons of hay for \$80,000; 2,200 tons of wheat, \$65,000; 2,500 tons of oats, \$35,000; 400 tons of barley, \$10,000; and 1,000 tons of peas, \$10,000.

Anderson, speaking for Hillsboro's six dry goods and apparel stores, pointed out that all merchants have a vital interest in the prosperity of farms and farmers, that merchants believe "what's good for the farmer is good for the merchant, and vice versa," and that "business goes where it is invited and stays where it is well treated."

Christensen, spokesman for Hillsboro's two banks, said banks can help the farmer in three ways—1. To diversify his crops. 2. To develop a soil conservation program and 3. By giving him counsel on financial matters and by pointing out how he may make more on his invested capital.

Will Buy at Home
Wilson, grocery representative, advised that although it is usually possible to buy some staple commodities at lower wholesale prices in Portland, that grocers here will continue to buy from local producers.

C. T. Richardson, condenser speaker, emphasized the need for a dairy products advertising program if dairymen hope to halt the decreasing consumption of fresh milk, butter and cheese.

Dr. J. O. Robb, speaking in behalf of his profession, urged farm-people with the peculiar and intimate services of doctors.

"The Other Side"
Patterson, lawyer representative, lawyers are too often known because of their connection with business and domestic failures. He reminded farmers that little is seen or heard of the lawyer's constructive achievements, of his part in the building of business, of his conciliatory role in threatening family break-ups.
