Couty Herds in Third Place for Butterfat Production in Month

Butterfat production of Washington county dairy cows listed this county in third place among the state's 22 dairy herd improvement associations for the month of April, according to the monthly bulletin of the Washington county association.

The average of 1533 cows tested in the county's 60 herds was 35.52 pounds, which was about 10 pounds under the top average of 46.16 pounds recorded in the Tillamook county.

Owner Sampler dairy herd improvement report, Tillamook county, with 1972 cows in 57 herds, was second with 38.59 pounds of butterfat per cow. The state average was 33.45 pounds of fat.

630 Herds in State

In the state, 16,098 cows were tested during the month. Of this number, embracing 630 herds, 6,117 were found to be producing 40 pounds of butterfat or better per month. Of the 1,339 cows tested in this county, 641 had produced 40 pounds of fat or more during the month.

Top production of the year ending this month was recorded by Mrs. Tom Williams, Forest Grove route 1, for Polly 3rd, a four-year-old registered Jersey with a 305-day production record of 242.2 pounds of milk. Second highest production mark for the year was made by Beth, a five-year-old registered Jersey, also on Mrs. Williams' farm, with a record of 620.3 pounds of fat.
