The 50,000 military aircraft requested by President Roosevelt will inevitably swell the nation's air personnel to the half million mark, a figure that dwarfs comparable existing effectiveness. The proportion of ground operatives to pilots is something like 7 to 1, and while there is no minimizing the importance of the men who take our wings aloft, the fact goes unchallenged that airplane mechanics are the heart of aviation. Air training schools, appreciating the realities indisociably bound up with a vast program of air expansion, are therefore placing solid emphasis on the problem of preparing competent ground personnel.
