Government Slates Civil Service Exams For Illustrator Post

The United States Civil Service commission has announced open competitive examinations to fill airbrush illustrator positions in the federal government. The examinations cover four grades, with salaries ranging from \$1,620 a year for the junior grade, to \$2,300 a year for the senior grade.

Applications must be on file with the commission's Washington office not later than August 26 if received from states east of Colorado, and not later than August 29, 1940, if received from Colorado and states westward.

A four-year high school course, or 14 units of high school study, in addition they must have had elementary illustrating training or experience, supplemented by experience in difficult air-brush retouching and similar work. Applicants may substitute additional experience for the high school education; and they may also substitute for part of the experience, completion of illustrative design or of commercial art courses in a recognized college or of residence art school. Applicants must not have passed their fifty-fifth birthday.

Full information as to the requirements for the examinations, and application forms, may be obtained from Fred Holzmagel, secretary of the Board of U. S. Civil Service Examiners, at the post office in this city.
