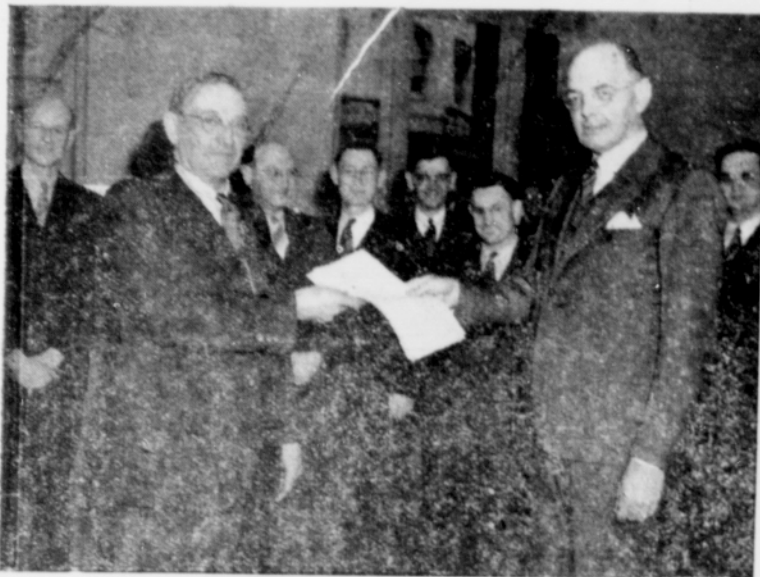


Time Turns Backward in '40 Picture Review

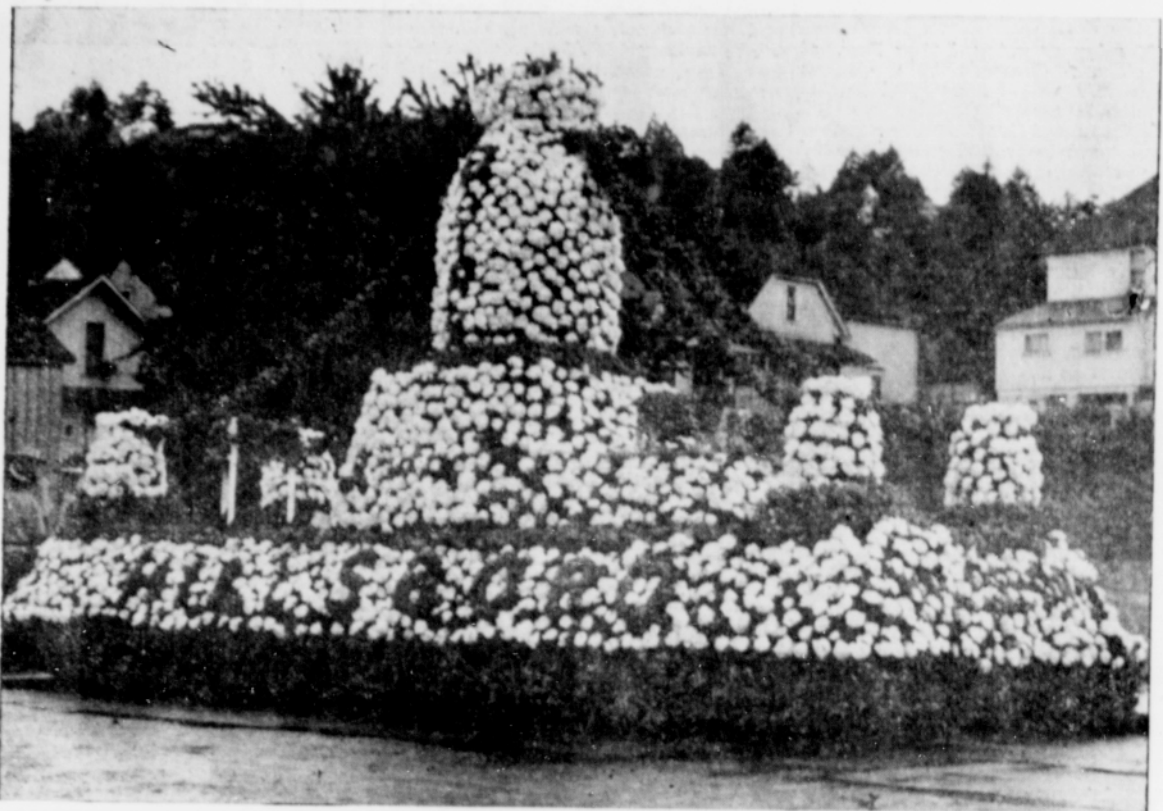
