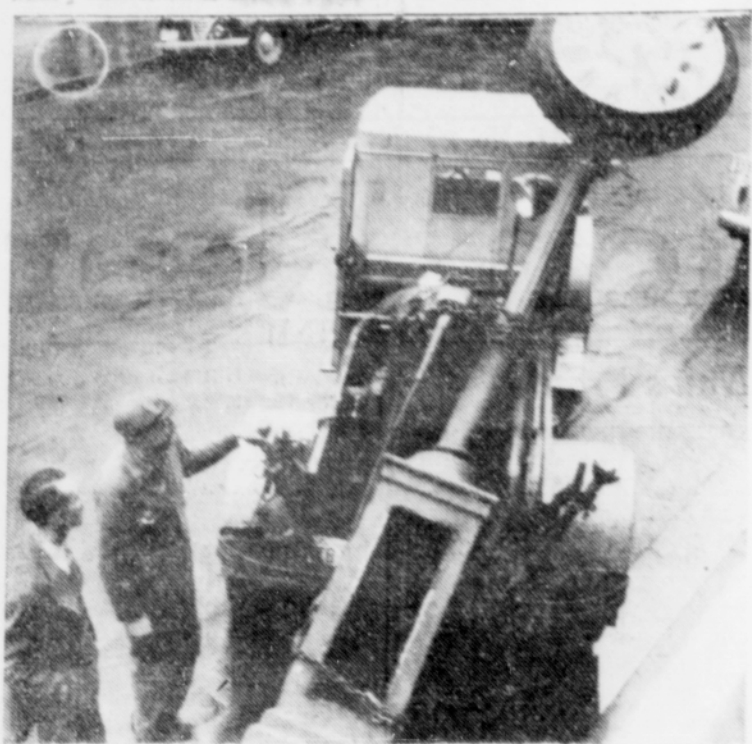


Main Street Timepiece Moved

MacKenzie Shows 1941 Fords



Increased wheelbase, larger inside body size and an improved ride features the new 1941 Ford line which had its initial Hillsboro showing at the MacKenzie Motor Co. last Friday. Four body types are offered in the deluxe line, six in the super deluxe. Among the refinements on all models are the speed lines on the side of both front and rear fenders, new hidden gasoline filler cap, electric light on the luggage compartment lid which automatically lights whenever the lid is raised if car lights are burning, ventilating front windows, new wide tempered glass one-piece rear window, radio grilles, twin windshield wipers, twin sun visors, fender top parking lamps and two-spoke, clear vision comfort-type steering wheels. A new four-cylinder truck and commercial engine is included in the Ford working line.

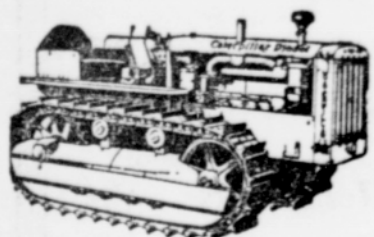
Rosedale P.T.A. Meets Friday

Three Charged
By Grand Jury;
One Gets Prison

Three true bills of indictment and one not true bill—three of the four involving morals charges—were returned by the Washington county grand jury which adjourned its regular October session on Friday.

Arnold Lee Taylor, 23, and John Muleback, 22, both of Portland, were jointly indicted on a charge of burglary not in a dwelling in one true bill. Arraigned in circuit court before Judge R. Frank Peters, Taylor pleaded guilty to the charge and was sentenced to serve two years in the state penitentiary. Muleback is at liberty on \$500 bond.

William Wilson, 47, Sherwood, and William Curt Pickens, 42, Beaverton route 2, are charged with morals offenses in the other two indictments and the not true bill absolves Raymond Estes, 44, Hillsboro route 5, on a statutory count.

Wilson and Pickens have entered not guilty pleas and dates have not yet been set for trials.

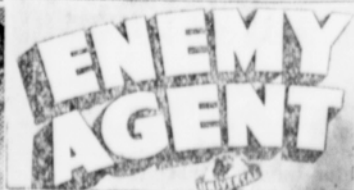
