Generous Plan Of Oil Firm Made Public

In a move to "co-operate with the federal government in every way possible in carrying out the national defense program," the Union Oil company notified all district managers this week of a number of guarantees to employees volunteering or called to service under the national guard act or the selective training and service act of 1940.

Subject to change only in cases where "circumstances have so changed as to make it impossible or unreasonable to carry out," the guarantees for employees thus terminating work with the company are:

1. With certain reasonable qualifications, employees will be re-employed with no loss in seniority rating on completion of training.

2. All employees who have served the company for an accumulated period of one year or more will receive pay equal to the difference between his government pay and the salary which he received from the company at the time of his induction for a period of three months.

3. In addition, the company will keep in full force for the 12-month period of training the non-contributory portion of each employee's group life insurance.
