

Hoop Season Plans Outlined; Townies Set Game

Opener Set for Newberg Jan. 3

Plans for the T. Y. V. basketball opener and for the season schedule of seven teams comprising the league were discussed at a meeting of T. Y. V. high school principals here Monday night.

The opener was set for Friday, January 3, at 7:30 p. m. in the Newberg high school gymnasium. The King's X affair will give 15 minutes of play to each of the seven T. Y. V. teams—Hillsboro, Forest Grove, Tigard, Sherwood, Newberg and West Linn—and McMinnville is to be invited to participate in the season-opening hoop playoff.

Committee in charge of the opener and season schedule is composed of Tom Fowler, Tigard principal; Herbert Armstrong, Newberg principal; and Loran Douglas, Newberg coach. The league schedule, drafted roughly Monday night, has not been finally approved.

Tourney Dates Set
The T. Y. V. principals also set February 27, 28 and March 1 for a double elimination tournament of Washington county teams in accordance with the new state high school basketball set-up. Washington county this year will send a representative to the state tournament instead of selecting a tournament entry through a district playoff such as has been held in past years.

The county tournament will schedule competition only among the teams within the county—Hillsboro, Beaverton, Forest Grove, Tigard and Sherwood. No place has been set as yet for the tourney.

A few pre-season practice skirmishes have been held during the past week on the Hillsboro map, but inasmuch as a number of potential basketball stars are still using football boots, Coach Hap Hathorn has not called any official sessions as yet. Hoop practice is not expected to get under way for another couple of weeks.

Townies Set for Game
The Hillsboro Townies, under tutelage of Keith Wilcox, have been practicing regularly, meanwhile, in preparation for their first game—against the First National bank team from Portland. The game will be played on the Hillsboro map at 8 p. m. Wednesday, November 27. Another game is being scheduled on the same evening for the Lions, second townie team here.

The business men's volleyball league will organize its four component teams at its regular weekly session tonight (Wednesday) in the Hillsboro gym.
