Vetch Not Desirable

The ordinary common vetch has been proven very desirable in the south, but in the north it is not so. Its use was restricted to the areas where the development of the vetch and alba strain of common vetch has apparently developed.

The vetch and alba strain of common vetch has been developed. It is a satisfactory to the southern farmer. Consequently, their production locally is due to increase. Vetch was increased in 1940 to a total of 1,400,000 acres, or over three quarters of a million pounds of clean seed.

Approximately half of this was shipped south for cover crop plantings.

The other half was allocated by the AAA to Western Oregon counties for planting for 1941 harvest. This will result, providing it all comes through the winter, to approximately 3,000 acres of vetch in the state.

Influenza has hit the community with more new cases being reported each day.

More than 10 per cent of the milk cows in Washington county are being tested regularly for butterfat production through some kind of production testing and the feed cost and value of this production calculated by the owners of these cows from the data obtained. The Washington county dairy herd improvement association now employs two full time testers and a third tester working on a half time basis.

Over 70 herds are in this herd improvement group totaling approximately 2,000 cows. The average annual production of cows in these herds is well over 300 pounds of fat per year and the production of the herds where the testing has been carried regularly has been steadily improved. This consistent testing program means, for the members who take advantage of it, the development of more economical production.

While these developments have been taking place there was for the first time some thought given to future land use problems and situations by resident and property owners in the north part of the county. Eighty-five thousand acres of land lying along the north edge of Washington county were covered in a land utilization study.

Use Outlined

This study developed several rather definite recommendations as to the future desirable use of these lands and certain specific suggestions as to things that need to be done to bring about suitable uses of these areas. Development of programs to carry out some of these things has begun and some progress has been made but there is much to be accomplished and since the entire program is new the progress is necessarily slow.

New crops that are bearing some attention and consideration are primarily seed crops. European war conditions have cut off some sources of certain seed supplies. This has stimulated interest in these crops locally and, particularly for some of them, it seems an opportune time to begin development of a larger seed growing industry. Most of these have to be entered into rather cautiously and require rather specific conditions for profitable production.
