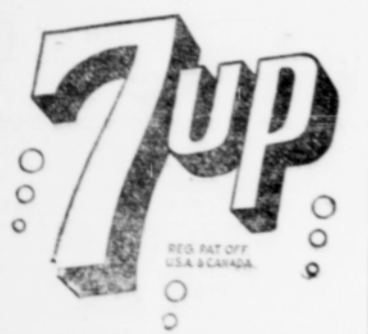


Circuit Court Jurors for March Term are Drawn
