

### Hit-Run Charge Draws \$100 Fine, Jail Sentence

Carl Alfred Anderson, 43, arrested by state police on a charge of hit-and-run, was fined \$100 and sentenced to 30 days in the county jail when he entered a guilty plea Saturday in the Tigarid justice court.

Leo Parnell Gaul, 27, Glencullen, was arrested and lodged in the county jail here last week on a charge of assault and battery. He has since been released on \$500 bail.
