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Tualatin Wins Twice In Softball Playoffs

Tualatin softballers, representatives of the Beaverton league handed defeats to the Cate Motor ten of Forest Grove and B. E. Maling's Hillsboro outfit as the District No. 5 double elimination playoffs got under way with games Monday and Tuesday nights.

Sauvies Island, Eastern Washington County league representatives, became the first tournament fatality by suffering defeat in each of their first two trials.

Maling's squad hit freely to smother the Islanders under a 23-13 score Monday night while Tualatin upset the dope with a 9-2 win over Cate Motor. The Cate team came back on Tuesday night here to take a 14-0 decision over the Island team and Tualatin again surprised the fans by taking Maling to task 5-2.

The consecutive wins for Tualatin automatically handed this team a bye assignment for last night (Wednesday) while Maling and Cate Motor tens battled it out at Forest Grove for the right to play Tualatin for the district championship and a berth in the state tournament at Oregon City.

The district championship tussle will be played at Beaverton, Tualatin home diamond tonight (Thursday). The state tournament opens Sunday, August 24, and will continue through Thursday, August 28.
