Home gardeners in Washington county and western Oregon are fortunate in the fact that it is possible to store much of the garden vegetable crop in the ground.

Beets, carrots, parsnips, salsify, turnips, and rutabagas may be kept in the ground in an ordinary season. In doing this it is usually a good plan to cut off the tops and cover them with dirt.

More complete storage information may be obtained from the county agent's office. A recent publication from the Oregon State college extension service entitled "Vegetable Storage" covers the more simple problems connected with storing these important vegetable food crops.

Frequent inquiries are being made at this time about blight on tomatoes and potatoes. Gardeners and commercial growers both are remembering the 1941 season when, beginning late in August, potatoes and tomatoes alike were virtually wiped out in Washington county by this one disease.

Prune Growers Called to Meet

A meeting of prune growers, drier operators and packers has been called for Tuesday, August 18, at 10 a. m. in the basement hearing room at the state house in Salem.

Unless corrective measures are taken in the harvest and preparation of the 1941 prune crop, many shipments of dried prunes from Oregon will be subject to seizure, Smith warned.
