Mrs. America Meets the War

Editor's Note: War touches every home and every citizen. This column, based on official government information and prepared by the Office of War Information, shows how the war will affect Mrs. America and her home.

New regulations of the War Production Board covering the manufacture of women's full fashioned rayon stockings are expected to result in increased quality, even of sheer stockings. The WPB conservation order, which goes into effect on May 15, restricts each manufacturer of women's rayon hosiery to seven basic colors for each six months period, and no more than five of the basic colors can be used in any one style. However, WPB pointed out that most hosiery manufacturers already had been voluntarily limiting their range of colors to this number or less incidentally. The dollars a cent price ceiling on rayon hosiery will not go into effect until May 15.

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Wilkesboro Home Destroyed by Fire

The home of Mr. and Mrs. Henry J. Vandenberg of Wilkesboro was completely destroyed by fire Monday evening when fire started on the roof when the chimney ignited. Quick work of the neighbors saved most of the downstairs furniture, but all of the civilian belongings of their son Patrick, in the armed forces in Louisiana, were burned.
