Hints Given by Extension Worker On Washing Greasy Work Clothes

To many homemakers the job of washing greasy, gritty overalls or slacks is a new one and a tough one, says Lucy R. Lane, extension specialist in clothing and textiles at Oregon State college. More work clothes are being worn today than ever before and they are getting dirtier than ever before, she says.

In handling greasy or unusually dirty clothes of any kind Miss Lane advises that time and effort will be saved in the long run by doing some preliminary cleaning before the overalls are put into a mechanical washer.

First, the worst of the dirt can be removed by scraping or brushing to take out dust, sand or bits of metal that may be clinging to grease. Then some lard or vaseline rubbed into the grease stains will loosen them if they are rubbed vigorously between the hands and then scraped with the dull edge of a knife. Some times this has to be repeated several times and the worst places sponged with carbon tetra-

High Schools Show Variance in Cost Pupil Education

Tigard high school showed the lowest per capita cost of educating pupils in Washington county last year, according to the annual reports on file with Austin T. Scraft, county school superintendent. Highest cost was reported by Gaston high school at \$248.13 per pupil.

Total operations cost at Tigard was \$26,506.54 with an average daily attendance of 252.12, while Gaston had a reported cost of \$7,851.04 and daily average attendance of 31.6.

Beaverton high school was second low in the county with a total expenditure of \$38,561.93, an average daily attendance brought the cost per student to \$98.20.

Hillsboro union high school reported a per capita cost of \$104.83, total costs being \$83,989.54 and the average daily attendance at 610.3. Sherwood's total expense of \$16,753.79 and average daily attendance of 130.4 made a per pupil cost of \$123.48.

Forest Grove's per capital cost was \$137.60 based on a total cost of \$50,983.42 and average daily attendance of 370.4. Banks union high school reported costs of \$14,587.35, average daily attendance of 105.8 and per pupil cost of \$137.87.
