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Goit Funeral Held Monday

REEDVILLE—Lafayette R. Goit, 89, died late August 12, following a sudden heart attack at his home in Reedville. Funeral services were held Monday at Donelson & Sewell chapel, Hillsboro, with Rev. Clifford Trout of the Christian church officiating. Interment was made in Forest View cemetery at Forest Grove.

He operated a blacksmith shop here for 27 years until last year, when he closed his shop because of lack of iron and other materials, and secured employment in the shipyards, where he was a valued craftsman. He stayed at home the past two weeks, but was busy about the place until the day of his death.

Born May 29 1863, in Michigan, he came to Oregon in 1912, and was married in Portland, July 14 1912, to Miss Anna M. Goedert. In 1916 the couple settled in Reedville, where she died early last year. In August, 1942, he was married to Mrs. Mathilde Behm, who survives. Other survivors are a daughter, Mrs. Thomas McNutt, Portland; two sisters, Mrs. Robert Young, Minnigoss, and Mrs. S. M. Fox, Michigan.

Wallpaper Sample Books Prohibited

In an effort to conserve wallpaper the wallpaper industry will no longer make up sample books is the word received by Lois A. Lutz, extension specialist in home management of Oregon State college, from the department of agriculture.

Miss Lutz adds that there is very little need for new sample books since no new wallpaper patterns will be produced this year. Only those previously designed and produced in 1942-43 will be made, according to recent rulings. The quantity manufactured will be about the same as last year, about 60 per cent of that produced in 1941-42.

Wartime limits on color and pigments have come about as a result of the limited supply of metallic inks. Paper may be produced with red, green, blue and yellow grounds. The silk screen process of manufacture has been found the most effective.

Homemakers will be wise to take good care of wallpaper now in the home, Miss Lutz suggests, since supplies are limited.
