During the period Washington county has turned in a total of 293 tons, or an average of 152 pounds per capita. Benton county ranks first with an average of 445 pounds of paper per capita.

Total of paper collected in the state amounts to 7,431 tons in the past six months for an average of 127 pounds per capita.
