Mr. and Mrs. Vena Martie of Portland have returned home after visiting at the M. W. Johnson home here.

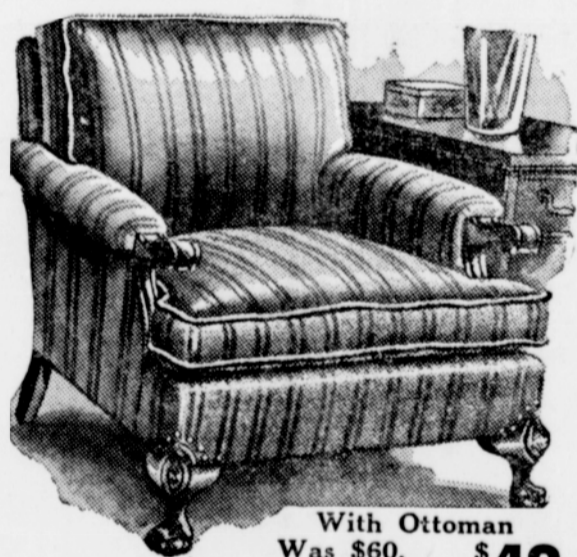

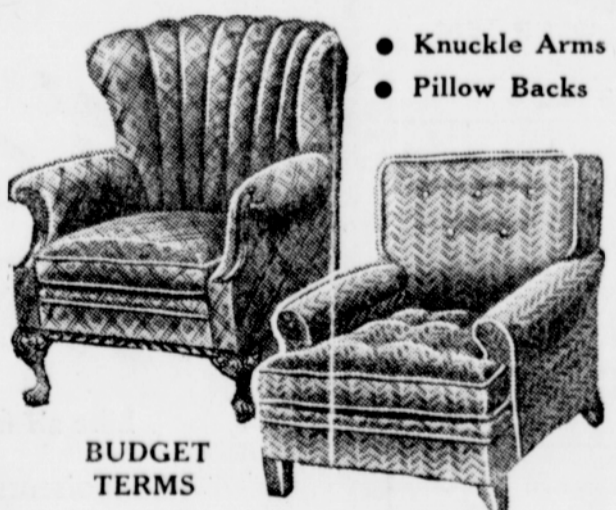

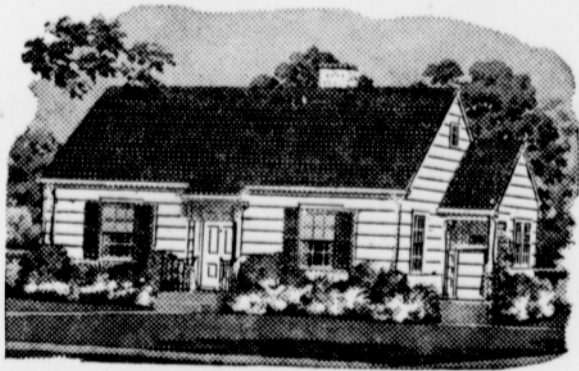
