Pressure Cooker Safety Tips Given

For home canning of meats and non-acid vegetables, which include all vegetables except tomatoes, the only method advocated is to use steam pressure canner. To can these at home with assurance of safety by other methods, it would be necessary to heat them so many hours that when finally done, the food would not be very good eating. In a pressure canner temperatures of 240 degrees F. or higher are produced.
