

Mrs. Johnson Crowned Pioneer Queen Mother

Mrs. Charles Johnson, 87 years old, was crowned "Queen Mother" of the county at the annual Pioneer association picnic Sunday at Shute park. Dr. Henry Young officiated at the ceremony. Her parents came to Oregon in 1852. Mrs. Johnson, widow of Charles M. Johnson, is a direct descendant of David Hill, for whom Hillsboro was named. John M. Brown was named president of the association, Fred and Mrs. L. C. Mooberry, secretary-treasurer.

Mrs. Carrie P. Blanchard of Portland was the main speaker, taking her topic, "Early Schools of Washington County." She taught at Leisville, Centerville, Columbia Academy, Shady Brook, and Raleigh. She received \$20 per month homes. Mrs. Blanchard came to Oregon in 1884 from Illinois, where she had taught for several years. Mrs. Meek of North Plains was another speaker. She told of early day experiences of her husband, S. A. D. Meek, with his brother Courtney and others in the Coeur d'Alene mines in Idaho. They made the trip in with their mules. Prices were high, flour being \$11.50 per 55-pound sack. She also told of their trip to Champoog—going to Hillsboro by horse and buggy, by train to Portland, and by river boat to Champoog.

Other program numbers included singing of America and the Oregon State song by the audience, led by Mrs. V. Gardner, with Mrs. Fred Sevel as accompanist; invocation by John Brown, president; "Pioneers," vocal solo, "Battle Hymn of the Republic," by Mrs. Gardner, with the assembly joining in the chorus; memorial offering for Mrs. Edythe Tozier Weaver, Samuel L. Ruffey, Charles M. Johnson, L. E. Wilkes, and S. A. Walker, by Rev. Young; song, "End of a Perfect Day," by Mrs. Gardner, and "Auld Lang Syne," by audience.

Mrs. Homer Stettinier and Mrs. Walter Henry of the Hillsboro Garden club presented corsages and buttonholes to the older members of the association.

A discussion followed about the condition of the cemetery around the graves of pioneers, and the David Hill monument. Mrs. Meek was appointed to see about appropriate markers for the graves of Albert Tozier and his sister, Mrs. Edythe Tozier, Fred Reed, the new vice-president, was appointed chairman of the committee.

RIPE TOMATOES MAKE A VERY TASTY JAM

This Quick, Easy Recipe Saves You Sugar

3½ Cups Ground Tomatoes
6 Cups Sugar
½ Cup Lemon Juice
½ Teaspoon Salt
1 Grated Lemon Rind
1 Package M.C.P. Pectin

Wash and pour boiling water over to remove slip off the skins and grind the fruit. Add the salt and grated lemon rind. Measure exactly 3½ cups of this mixture (add water to fill out last cup, if necessary) into a large kettle. Add the M.C.P. Pectin, stir well and bring to a boil, stirring constantly. NOW, add the sugar (which has been previously measured), mix well and bring to a full rolling boil. BOIL EXACTLY 4 MINUTES. Remove from fire, let boil subside, stir and skim by turns for 5 minutes. Pour into sterilized jars, allowing ½-inch space for sealing with fresh paraffin.
