### Portland Minister To Talk on Alaska

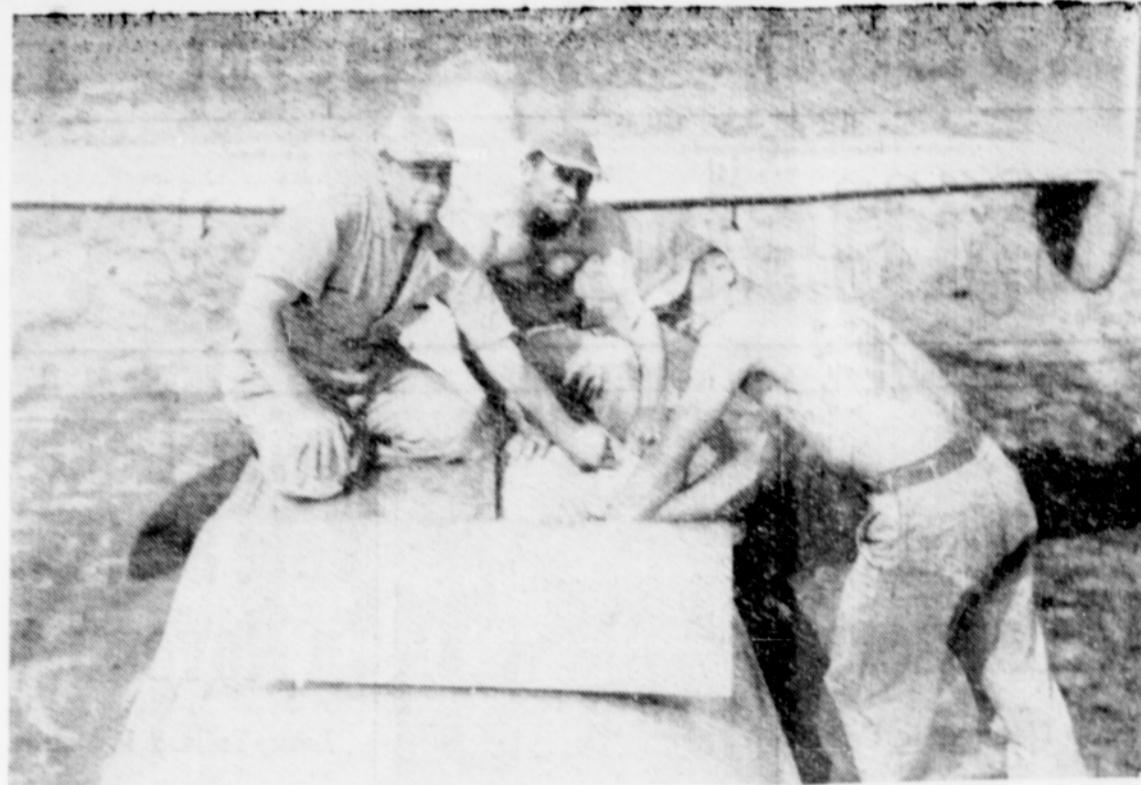
