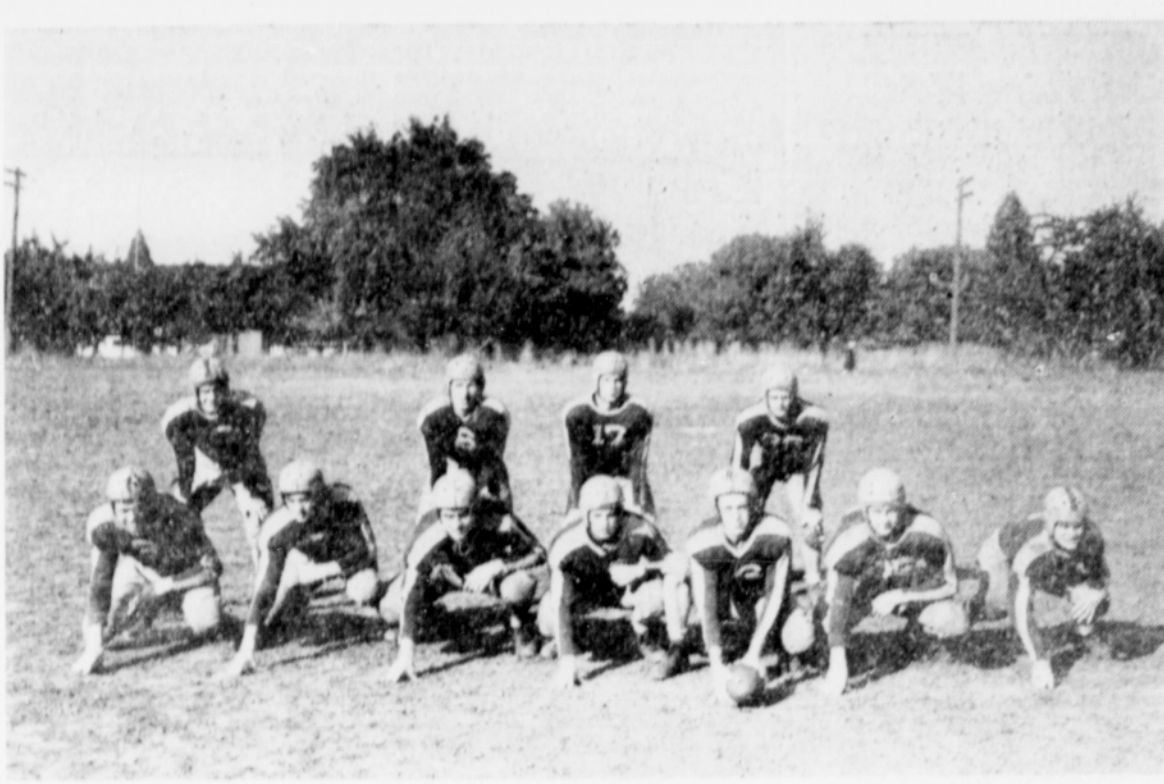

defeat for second spot on the league ladder. The Vikes are in fourth place with three victories and three losses.

### Spartans Determined

However, the Spartans will not be caught off guard by the favorite Spartans again this year. Coach Al Bogue's charges have spent the week and a half since the Beaver-ton clash polishing up their game and brewing bad medicine and a few surprises for the invaders. Forest Grove apparently revels in its rating as the "under dog" and Coach Art Brachmann promises a few surprises by the Vikes.

Speeches of the Spartan attack will be fleet-footed Jack Doyle, triple-threat right halfback and 1943 T.Y.V. all-star. Capable running mates will be Left Half Rod Harman who has done some brilliant open field running this season, line-smashing Fullback Duane Janney, Chapman and Quarterback Tommy Straughan, stellar blocking back. Hillsboro's forward wall, which has turned in a bang-up job on both offense and defense, is expected to hold the key of the Spartan running attack and defense. At center will be Captain Walt McKinney, at guards Veteran Lynn Hall and Jerry Schwanke, at tackles Wayne Faber and Bill Heinrich and at ends Bob MacKenzie and Bob Amacher.

Another right halfback, Pres Kirry, will be the kingpin of the Viking show and can be expected to turn on the speed in earnest today. His backfield mates, Left Half Jack Williams, Fullback Dave Knapp and Quarterback Robert Young, all of plenty of scoring possibilities. Key of the line will be rugged Brady Waters, the Grove's veteran center. Flanking him will be Don Smith and Rus McKean, guards; Floyd Bechtel and Brown, tackles; Pete Clapham and Bob Scotten, ends.

Hillsboro holds the edge on wins during the 26-year-old rivalry between Hilhi and the Grove with 15 victories to 9. Two games ended in ties. The Vikings, however, have the advantage on total score with 278 points to 219 for Hillsboro. Largest score was the 72-0 swamping handed Hilhi by Forest Grove in the first game back in 1916. Hilhi's first victory was 15-14 in 1921. The locals opened a string of eight consecutive victories in 1935 which was broken last year when the Vikes upset the Spartans 7-2.

Forest Grove came from behind in the final seconds of play last Friday to defeat the visiting Tigard eleven 14 to 7. Halfback Jack Williams snared a Tigard pass on his own 36-yard stripe and raced 64 yards to score the touchdown that broke the 7-7 tie.

The Vikings opened the scoring in the second period, moving from the Grove 27 on line plays to the Tigard four, from where Williams boomed into pay dirt. Tigard knotted the score at the start of the fourth period with a 75-yard drive with Colback White picking up the points. Shortly afterward Williams grabbed the Tigard pass and raced for the touchdown that pulled the game out of the fire.

At Tillamook the McMinnville Grizzlies ran rough shod to win 26 to 6. Newberg took a 32 to 0 lacing from Gresham in a district playoff game. The Tigers held Gresham to a lone score in the first half, but wilted in the final half.
