Two of the seven indictments returned by the county grand jury last week involved law enforcement officers. S. C. Sheriff J. W. Connell said that Dotson was dismissed as a deputy sheriff when the indictment was returned.

Others indicted and charged are Earl Buchanan, Forest Grove, Donald LeRoy Schwartz, larceny in a dwelling house, and Harold D. Simonsen, larceny.

The grand jurors were excused until December 18.

Dotson and Heavensham pleaded not guilty when arraigned in circuit court Monday.

Earl Buchanan pleaded guilty Tuesday morning to the burglary charge and was sentenced to serve three years in the state prison. He was taken to Salem Wednesday by Deputy Dick Busch.

Girl Receives Gunshot Wound

Ester Bernice Johnson, 17, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William Johnson of route 2, Gaston, was shot in the head while riding down the road toward her home the night of November 21 after accompanying part way home some girls, who had been visiting with her. She was rushed to Portland Sanitarium with serious head wounds from a shotgun.

Ester is reported by the attending physician to have 100 bird shot in the head, most of them in the scalp, right eye injured, and she had a slight concussion of the brain and may lose her right eye.

Report of investigating officers revealed that the shooting resulted from efforts on the part of two boys to scare Ester and not thinking that the gun was loaded.

One boy, 14, admitted that he pointed the gun at her in the belief that it was unloaded and that when he realized what had happened he heard a loud noise followed by a scream for help. Dropping the gun, he went to assistance and helped her home. Both boys were turned over to juvenile authorities, but were later released to their parents.

Charles James Bond was arrested Thursday night by State Officer Herder and placed in the county jail charged with assault while armed with a dangerous weapon. He is charged to have shot a gun at a car following an altercation in a beer parlor on the highway near the Masonic home.

Sentence was continued on conditions in circuit court November 22 for Wilson Harper Chaves, charged with forgery.

Application for writ of habeas corpus of John Henry Hannan was granted under advisement by Judge R. Frank Peters following arguments by counsel.
