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WAKE UP AMERICA! Should We Bomb the Palace and Hang Hirohito?

Should We Bomb the Palace and Hang Hirohito? As debated by James R. Young, Author of "Behind the Rising Sun" and "The Road to Tokyo"; Tom Wallace, Editor of "The Louisville Times".

MR. YOUNG OPENS: Emperor Hirohito is supreme commander of Japan's army and navy—

Emperor Hirohito is supreme commander of Japan's army and navy—he fixes the personnel and strength; makes treaties; declares war. Since 1869, the civilian cabinet has had no part in the emperor's decision on matters of peace or war.

No person of respectable culture would advocate poking about in Japan destroying temples. The royal palace in Tokyo was not constructed by the present Japanese Government.

Emperor Hirohito, the Rasputin of Japan, heads a religion which tolerates savagery and barbarism. A granite marker would stand at the palace with "Hirohito lived the Mikado who stabbed us in the back, used poison gas on helpless Chinese, approved the execution of the Doolittle flyers, allowed the torturing of Christian missionaries, the bayoneting of wounded soldiers and the bombing of houses of God."
