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Pasteurizing Plant Installed at Dairy

REEDVILLE—Engineers from a Portland dairy supply firm last week completed the installation of a modern pasteurizing plant, constructed entirely of stainless steel, which is now in operation at the Reedville dairy. Carl Traubel, owner of the dairy, has been distributing raw bottled milk in the Portland area, under the inspection of that city's board of health, since 1922, and will now supply both raw and pasteurized milk to his customers. His sons Loren and Howard Traubel are associated with their father in the business, Loren in charge of pasteurizing, and Howard in charge of distribution.

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Farm-Minded Vets To Receive Advice

schools, churches and health services.

The report supplies a list of bulletins available at the county agents' office relative to economic farm units in Oregon.

The veterans' agricultural advisory committee which prepared the recommendations included Chairman Guerber, Carl Bechen of Forest Grove, E. A. Griffith of Hillsboro, Arthur Stock of Forest Grove, Milton Simon of star route Forest Grove, David Cereghino of route 4, Sherwood, Mrs. Arthur Connell of route 1 Hillsboro, and Mrs. G. W. Kurtz of route 1 Gales.

L. R. Breithaupt, extension agricultural economist from Oregon State college, discussed the agricultural outlook on a long-time basis and its relation to veteran opportunities in agriculture. He pointed out that gains and losses in farm land prices generally lagged behind the rise and fall of farm incomes. Miss Lois Lutz, extension home management specialist from Oregon State college, outlined the outlook for the farm home, pointing out that farm incomes would probably be lower in the near future and that quality of materials would also go down.

Agricultural trends in Oregon and particularly Washington county, were outlined by Palmer S. Tervend, county agent. He presented charts comparing farm incomes for the periods 1926-1930, 1938-1940 and 1942 and the relative per cent of these incomes derived from various crops. He pointed out that dairy products, poultry, grain and hay and small fruits showed a declining trend, while livestock, forage crop seeds, truck crops and special horticultural products were showing an upward trend.

General discussion indicated that there were changes due in the future of farming in the county as a result of labor-saving machinery and various surpluses built up during the war.

Details of how the selective service boards plan to assist the returning veterans were outlined by Major Walker of the state selective service commission.

The meeting, held in the county court room, was attended by approximately 40 farm representatives.
