

Local Business Men Talk on Varied Subjects at Chamber Meet Tuesday

V. W. Gardner, W. C. Christensen and C. T. Richardson spoke at the chamber of commerce luncheon Tuesday on a program featuring "little known facts about well known people." The little known facts were furnished by J. H. Garrett, who was program chairman. Gardner discussed the change in Oregon's timber crop from the time he came to Oregon in 1896, pointing out that only four of the ten big lumber mills that were operating in Portland at that time are now running. He called attention to the decrease in the output of lumber, the biggest depletion in the timber crop, he said, has been due to forest fires. Gardner told of the need for tree farms or a program of reforestation to maintain the industry, declaring that the state was doing little in the way of reseeded.

Projects Outlined
Community projects and their relative importance were discussed by W. C. Christensen. He placed the water system improvement as No. 1 and called attention to the fact that a survey was nearing completion. Proposal is to increase the water supply here by three times the present capacity. The project, he explained, will be undertaken in two projects, the first being from the intake to the reservoir.

Need for a comprehensive school building and renovation program was stressed by the banker, who said the school board is now working on a project to be presented

Water Improvement Approved by Voters

West Slope water district, comprising the section between Sylvan and Beaverton, voted 721 to 104 in favor of a \$175,000 bond issue for post-war improvement of the facilities supplying Bull Run water to residents.

Plans call for the installation of a 12-inch main connecting with Portland's supply system and the construction of three reservoirs, the largest of which will hold 500,000 gallons of water. This will increase the present capacity of the system seven or eight times and will provide for anticipated increased population and for fire fighting.

Re-Creation Bethany School Area Asked

Petition seeking the re-creation of the Bethany elementary school district near Washington county, the district boundary board, Bethany and Union districts voted to consolidate last September.

Petitions asking the consolidation of Cooper Mountain and Raleigh districts with Beaverton were filed Monday, according to Austin T. Scraftford, county school superintendent.

Expatriation Dates Set Food Stamps

Reestablishment of definite expatriation dates for food ration stamps have been announced by the OPA. Each series will be good for about four months.

New schedule of validation and expatriation dates are as follows:

Red stamps—Q3, R3 and S3, valid since December 3, good through March 31; T3, U3, V3, W3 and X3, valid since December 31, good through April 28; Y3, Z3, A2, B2, C2 and D2, valid January 28, good through June 2.

Blue stamps—X3, Y3, Z3, A2 and B2, valid since December 1, good through March 31; C2, D2, E2, F2 and G2, valid since January 1, good through April 28; H2, J2, K2, L2 and M2, valid February 1, good through June 2.

Sugar stamps—No. 34, valid since November 16, good through February 28; No. 35, valid February 1, good through June 2.

Red tokens are not affected by the new invalidation plan. They will remain in use as change for good stamps in the meats-fats program.

The action was taken to avert any additional overnight cancellations, such as occurred Christmas week.
