Collects 4 Tons Paper

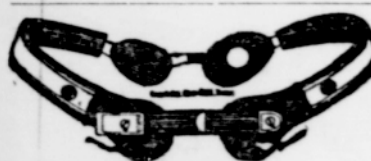
MOUNTAINDALE — Mountaindale school paper drive has just ended and all together the students collected approximately four tons of paper.
