The business was started in June, 1890, by Brock & Sell in the present location and the store has been operated in the same location ever since. Other owners have included the late doctors, S. T. Linklater and J. P. Tammis, and Frank Mitchell bought the business in March, 1914. Engeldinger became a partner in December, 1921, and purchased the Mitchell interest in May, 1941. Mr. and Mrs. Engeldinger have operated the store since that time.
