Baking with FRESH PRODUCE

GLAZED FRESH STRAWBERRY PIE
4 cups fresh strawberries 1/4 tsp. salt
Baked pastry shell 1 tbsp. butter or margarine
1 cup water 2 to 3 drops red food coloring
1/4 cup sugar
4 tbsps. cornstarch
Wash and hull strawberries. Fill baked 9-inch pastry shell with 3 cups whole berries. Crush remaining 1 cup berries; cook with water 5 minutes; strain. To make glaze: Combine sugar, cornstarch and salt; add to strained juice; and cook 3 minutes, or until thick and clear, stirring constantly. Add butter or margarine and red coloring. Cool slightly. Pour glaze by spoonfuls over fruit, being careful to coat all thoroughly. Chill. Serve plain or garnish with whipped cream or ice cream and whole berries. Makes 1 9-inch pie. Serves 6 to 8.

PAN-FRIED CHERRIES
An excellent accompaniment to meat or poultry.
2 tbsps. butter or 4 tbsps. brown sugar
3 cups cherries
Melt butter or margarine in heavy frying pan; add cherries and sugar; cover, and cook slowly 15 minutes, or until cherries are tender. Serves 6. Note: May pit cherries before pan-frying.
