Local Man Wins A Bronze Star

Hq., 41st DIVISION, Philippines — Sgt. John M. Christensen, son of Mr. and Mrs. Carl Christensen of Hillsboro, has been awarded the bronze star medal for heroic achievement and exemplary devotion to duty on the field of battle. Sgt. Christensen was awarded the decoration by Major Gen. Jens A. Doe, commander of the famed 41st infantry division, at the conclusion of the Japanese Zambonga campaign.

Christensen graduated from the Hillsboro high school in 1940, where he was a member of the football team. In September 1941, a member of the Oregon national guard, he was called to federal service.

In March, 1942, he came overseas with the 41st division, the first infantry organization to join Gen. MacArthur's command. Since then he participated in two long, harrowing jungle campaigns in New Guinea before the Philippines operations.

At war's conclusion Christensen plans to pursue a college education.
