and maintain water and electric systems, but does not provide for reconstruction, repair, extend and improve such systems. Deletion from the section "of the clause as to franchises now expired" is being undertaken as the charter was enacted in 1923 and all franchises in force at that time have since expired. A charter amendment enacted several years ago provides that all franchises must be submitted to a vote of the people.

Voting will take place in the council chambers of the city hall from 8 a. m. to 8 p. m. November 30. At the discretion of the judges of the election, the polls may be closed for one hour between the hours of 12 o'clock noon and 2 p. m. Any qualified voter, who has been a resident of Hillsboro for six months, may vote.

The city utilities commission presented a resolution to the city council August 7 requesting authorization of a \$650,000 bond issue to finance the project. The resolution was passed.
