The locals grabbed a first-half lead of 18 to 16 but were unable to hold it in the final minutes. Manager Joe Jaross again led the Imperial quintet with nine points, followed by brother Walt and Don Shattuck, guards, who had eight apiece. Melboer of the Firemen was high for the game with 11.

Forest Grove is tied with the Portland Firemen for top position in the Federal league. The Northwest Insulators defeated the Washington county team by a score of 37 to 36 Monday night.

Bill Goetter Holds First in State Pin Meet

Bill Goetter, veteran Hillsboro bowler, set the pace for a group of locals entered in the fifth annual men's state bowling tournament in Portland last week-end by firing a series of 699 to take first place in the class A singles.

Goetter, who rolled a 695 to win the men's fall doubles and singles tourney at the Portland alleys, put together games of 213-211-244 to steal the show Saturday.

Several other local pinmen made good showings against the strong field from all parts of the state. Herman Rehse and Ray Dillon of Rushlow Insurance grabbed second place in the Commercial doubles event with a score of 1196. Rehse rolled a 236 first game and had a series of 632.

Willard Hughes and Hallie Ireland, also representing Rushlow Insurance, fired a 1133 to take second place in the Commercial doubles. Oakes Grocery team was in fifth place in the Booster team event with a 2390. Matt Thevesen and Eugene McDow were seventh in the booster doubles.

The state tourney, which is being held at Central and Portland alleys, is scheduled to end on Sunday, January 20, so the marks posted last week-end will be under fire this week-end.

Mrs. Jack Joel Rushlow of Hillsboro teamed with Katie Brower of Portland to take second place in the class A doubles event in the ladies' state tournament at Central alleys with a 1026 score.

Josephine and Katie are second only to a score of 1044, which is said in Portland to be the highest ladies' doubles score ever bowled in the state tournament.
