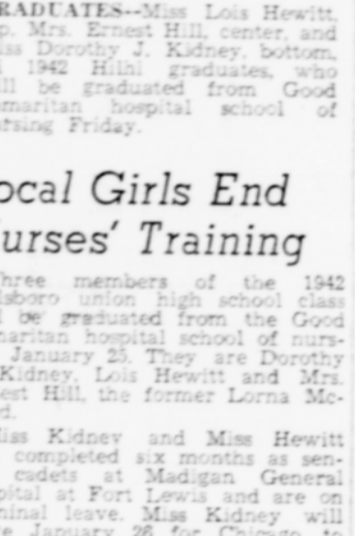
Buxton Man Weds Los Angeles Girl
