

Strike Control Measure Gains Congress Support

New and far-reaching strike control legislation gained wide-spread support in congress as further efforts were made Wednesday to effect settlement of two of the country's major labor disputes—strikes in the steel and automobile industries.

Ira Mosher, president of National Association of Manufacturers, said Wednesday the nation needs "an overall national labor policy which can serve as a foundation for industry."

The CIO United Automobile Workers union settled its wage dispute Saturday with Ford Motor company and Chrysler corporation at about half the originally demanded 30 per cent increase.

Walter P. Reuther, vice-president of CIO Auto Workers union, said Sunday that General Motors "must pay a higher wage increase than Ford or Chrysler" in order to "compensate for effects of the 67-day-old strike."

Lewis Back in A. F. of L.

John L. Lewis returned his 500,000 mine workers to the American Federation of Labor Friday. Lewis was quickly given a seat on the

The stock market staged one of its strongest sessions in years Monday with prices of industrial shares soaring from \$1 to \$6 on a wave of optimism over the labor picture.

"Strike Against Strikers"

A nation-wide farmers' "strike against strikers" is the object of Clay county, Neb., farmers who vowed to withhold their products from markets until industrial disputes are settled, it was announced Tuesday.

Warning Held Ample

Former Supreme Court Justice Owen J. Roberts testified Monday that his Pearl Harbor investigation commission knew the Hawaii army and navy commanders did not get intercepted Japanese code messages, but felt they were amply warned.

Capt. E. M. Zacharias told the committee Monday that he warned Admiral Kimmel in March, 1941, that Japan would at some open her war against the United States with a Sunday carrier raid on Hawaii.

To Atom Bomb Fleet

Plans for a fleet of 97 American, German and Japanese warships to be atom-bombed in a remote area of the Marshall Islands next May in the mightiest peacetime scientific experiment ever attempted by man were announced Thursday.

Set Flight Record

The transcontinental flight record was shattered Saturday by three U. S. army jet-propelled planes, which streaked from Long Beach, Cal., to New York at speeds approaching that of sound. The time taken was four hours, 13 minutes and 26 seconds.

Reds Claim Deal

The Moscow radio Saturday said that the U. S. and Great Britain had promised Russia the Kurile Islands of northern Japan under terms of the Yalta agreement.

Radar-Moon Contact Made

The war department announced Thursday night that army signal corps scientists had made radar contact with the moon in an experiment which promises "valuable peacetime as well as wartime applications."

Holds Draft Vital

Secretary of War Patterson said Monday that continuation of the draft "of vital concern to men overseas." It ends May 15 unless congress acts.

Urges Housing Price Control

Broad expansion of housing price controls was advocated Tuesday by Wilson Wyatt, national housing expediter, to bring living space within the range of veterans' pocketbooks.

Harry Hopkins Dies

Harry Hopkins, trusted aide of the late President Roosevelt, died in New York Tuesday.

Picketing Youths Shut Movie

Striking for lowered admission charges, 160 Verona high school students last week threw a locked-arm picket wall around the town's only theatre, forcing a complete shutdown by the owner.
