FAR EAST AIR SERVICE COMMAND, THE PHILIPPINES—Captain Edmund Burke Tongue of Portland has been assigned to the Far East Service Command headquarters, Manila. This command is responsible for the supply, repair, maintenance, advance and disposal of all AAF aircraft and equipment in the Far East.
