

Mobile Chest X-Ray Units Visit Here

Washington county will again be visited by the Mobile Chest X-Ray unit only this time two units will serve the county instead of one as last April. Dates scheduled for the county are March 11 to 16 inclusive, and the hours will be from 9 a. m. to 5 p. m. with a 15-minute rest during the morning and the same period in the afternoon.

These visits are made possible by the state board of health and the Oregon Tuberculosis association co-operating with the Washington County Public Health association. It is urged that everybody avail themselves of the opportunity to have a free chest X-ray and thereby help to eradicate the disease by finding the early symptoms. Those having taken the X-ray in April are requested to do so again, as well as those never having taken it.
