Sgt. Ed Hurd Gets Army Discharge

Sgt. (T/3) Ed Hurd, son of Mr. and Mrs. E. L. Hurd of Hillsboro, received his discharge from the army Sunday at Fort Lewis, Wash., after approximately 35 months of duty. Hurd served 16 months overseas.

He served in signal intelligence work for the signal corps at New Delhi, India, arriving back at New York on May 19 on the U.S.S. General Sturgis. A member of the enlisted reserve, he went on active status in July, 1943. He received preliminary training at Camp Kohler, Cal. Hurd graduated from Hilt in 1932.

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Kenneth Linklater Wins Commendation

Major Kenneth A. Linklater, formerly of Hillsboro, received a commendation from the army air forces for his work during the war. The commendation reads as follows:

1. It has been brought to my attention that while assigned to this headquarters from January 24, 1943, to March 25, 1945, you discharged your duties and responsibilities in a manner worthy of commendation.

During this assignment your ability to promote the coordination of activities within the Integrated Intelligence System contributed substantially to the successful accomplishment of the county-intelligence mission within the army air forces. The excellent results obtained through your extensive liaison activities with the commands in the field were due to your ability to blend aggressiveness with tact while engaged in the important task of insuring that lower echelons of command understood and executed the counterintelligence policies developed by the war Department and by this Headquarters.

3. It is indeed a pleasure to forward this commendation and, by direction of the Secretary of War, you are hereby authorized to wear the Army Commendation Ribbon.
