

Hillsboro-Portland Skyline Stage Route Hearing Set for June 17

ALPHA-HUBER—A hearing will be held by the Public Utilities Commission in regard to the proposed inter-urban bus line of the Skyline stages in the county court rooms June 17 at 10 a. m.

The proposed service is designed to accommodate off-the-highway commuters and furnish point-to-point transportation in the area between Hillsboro and Portland.

It calls for seven round trips per day over a route round trips per day in Hillsboro, out east Main street and Baseline road to Tobias avenue, thence east to Stacy avenue, south to the highway, east to Wheeler avenue, south to Chapman's Corners, east on Farmington

road to Beaverton and into Portland via Canyon road. Stand-by buses are to be available at all times to assure that all passengers are accommodated.

The Portland city council has granted permission to load and discharge passengers at Fifth and Yamhill streets and at 14th and Main. These points will also be used in the proposed route serving the Jacktown and Scholls Ferry road areas for which a charter is also requested by Skyline Stages, and which is to be discussed at the hearing.

The company planning to operate these stages has pledged that all profit from the lines will be turned back into new equipment as available until new and adequate equipment to serve communities affected is procured.

The Public Utilities Commission as well as Skyline Stages urge all interested persons to attend the hearing on June 17.
