Why union labor should feel that it has a "kick" coming in the passage by the congress of Hobbs anti-racketeering measure and its signing by President Truman is hard for the common individual to understand.

The president said that before signing the bill he had been advised by the attorney general that the measure does not in any way interfere with legitimate union activities.

There is no good reason why any segment of our population should be exempted from laws against interference with interstate commerce by extortion or robbery.

This measure cannot be considered as a substitute for a comprehensive labor-management code that should have the early attention of the congress as has been pointed out on numerous occasions and particularly at the time of the rail strike.
