Among the most important features of the celebration is the patriotic program, sponsored by the Allied Veterans Commanders' Council, in which the privilege of being an American is retold to the good of us all. Lack of adequate seating has been a handicap to attendance at these programs, but it is hoped that by another year the city will have taken steps to solve this unsatisfactory situation. All Should Be Alike Under Law

Why union labor should feel that it has a "kick" coming in the passage by the congress of Hobbs anti-racketeering measure and its signing by President Truman is hard for the common individual to understand. The measure makes it unlawful for unionists, in common with anyone else, to interfere with interstate commerce by extortion or

Labor spokesman had denounced the bill on grounds that it would jeopardize the legitimate rights of unions. Both A. F. L. President Green and CIO's President Murray had appealed to the president for a veto. The act constitutes an amendment of the 1934 racketeering act. The supreme court ruled in 1942 that the act as it stood could not be applied to alleged extortion committed by union

The president said that before signing the bill he had been advised by the attorney general that the measure does not in any way interfere with legitimate union activities, which include the right to strike and take other concerted peaceful action.

There is no good reason why any segment of our population should be exempted from laws against interference with interstate commerce by extortion or robbery. In fact no one should be permitted to interfere with commerce of any kind by extortion or robbery, both of which are deemed criminal in any man's language.

This measure cannot be considered as a substitute for a comprehensive labor-management code that should have the early attention of the congress as has been pointed out on numerous occasions and particularly at the time of the rail strike. An over-all labor-management measure that is fair to labor, management and the public is one of the nation's greatest needs.

Unselfishness Shown to World

The Philippine quest for independence, started more than 300 years ago, was realized on our own Independence Day through the volunteer act of the United States. This act should serve to dispel any thoughts among nations of the world and as voiced on several occasions by Russia that this country seeks to impose its will and rule the

This is truly an example of a nation following the Golden Rule of "doing unto others as you would have others do unto you." The United States has kept faith with the Filipinos-has given them the freedom which we all

While strife goes on in many corners of the globe over the question of independence, this voluntary act on the part of the United States should win the respect of all peoples and make them realize like nothing else could that the American people are not selfish.

. . . Truly deserved is the award of the Amos E. Voorhies trophy for outstanding editorial public service and accomplishments to Merle Chessman, publisher of the Astoria Astorian-Budget. Senator Chessman has given outstanding service to his community and state, having played a leading role in bringing the Tongue Point naval station to Oregon, his services toward reduction of port and city bonded debt, as well as many other activities. The Voorhies trophy is much coveted in the newspaper profession and its award is considered a distinct honor.



In America? A .- John Eliot printed the New Testament in 1661 and the whole Bible in 1663, both in an Indian dialect. This was the first Bible translated and printed in a new language for purposes of evangelization. It was also the first Bible printed in all the Americas.

Q .- Where in the Bible is the expression, "Out of the frying pan Into the fire"?

A .- It is not in the Bible, but the frying pan is mentioned twice in the Scriptures. Leviticus 2:7: "And if thy oblation be a meat offering baken in the fryingpan, it shall be made of fine flour with oil." And Leviticus 7:9: "And all the meat offering that is baken in the oven, and all this is dressed in the fryingpan, and in the pan, shall be the

about the soul? A .- It says a lot about health and right living. 3 John 2: "Beloved, I wish above all things that thou mayest presper and be in health, even as thy soul prospereth."
