

Reduction in Unemployment Tax Rate Shown

The average unemployment tax rate has been reduced to 1.65 per cent, saving 7336 employers nearly six millions in contributions on 1946 payrolls, Chairman T. Morris Dunn of the State Unemployment Compensation commission announced last year employers saved \$4,650,000 on an average experience rate of 1.98 per cent.

Highest average rate went to Jefferson county employers with 2.39 per cent, while Curry county firms are averaging 2.36 per cent and Tillamook 2.03. In all these counties logging and mill activities predominate. Closely following are Douglas 1.96, Josephine 1.96, and Linn 1.93 with heavy lumbering interests.

Lowest average rate was recorded for Harney county employers with 1.04 per cent. Gilliam 1.17, Sherman 1.31, Crook 1.33 and Deschutes 1.39. Counties with large covered payrolls had the following average rates: Marion 1.77, Clatsop 1.43 and Clatsop 1.42. A steady reduction in average tax rates from normal 2.7 per cent has been recorded every year since experience rating took effect in 1941. Rates formerly ranged from 3 to 2.7 per cent, but this year a low rate of 0.5 per cent is in effect.
