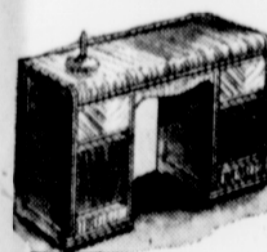

## Tualatin Rodeo Attracts Many; Animal Loses Interest in Bull Fight

Upwards of 3000 rodeo fans were on hand to see the Tualatin Valley Rodeo show on the grounds three miles east of Hillsboro the afternoon of July fourth and they were treated to a lively program. The American style team fight failed to materialize as planned, however, since the animal spotted an open catch pen at the very start and withdrew itself from further competition leaving the cowhands with nothing to chase. The prize money was split among 10 entries.

Several performers sustained bruises before the show was over and Benzi Fournier of Portland came out of the bareback bronc event with a broken wrist.

The hard-riding Forest Grove Ranch Riders took two firsts in two team events and the Washington County Westerners one. The Forest Riders won the team bareback relay and the pony express race. The Bob Webb team won second and the Washington County Westerners third in the bareback event.

The Westerners took their firsts in the shuttle relay for women with Forest Grove second. John Zeiger team was runner-up in the pony express race. Donna Gordon won first in the cowgirl race, beating out Ruth Simpson who defeated two men riders in the first heat of the quarter mile race with a nice riding performance.

None of the cowboys managed to win two events although several placed in different types of competition. Barney Bernard was first in the calf roping and second in bulldozing. Glen Robinson took first in the wild cow milking contest and third in the calf roping and bulldozing events. John Seideman won the bulldozing and was third in the saddle bronc. Gordon Holbrook was winner of the kids race.

Shiverton won over Salem, 9 to 0, in a home game July 3 to annex the Marion county title and McMinnville took a 2-to-1 edge over Newberg in five-game Yamhill county series by winning 9 to 3, June 30. The winner of Hillsboro and Gresham meets the Marion-Yamhill winner in a two-out-three series for the right to enter the state (four teams) finals, according to State Senator Paul Patterson of Hillsboro, manager of the state Legion Junior baseball committee.

Three Tualatin valley league teams—Sheridan, Forest Grove and Cornelius—are entered in the 16-team double elimination Oregon semi-pro baseball tournament which opens at Westminster park in Portland July 16. Winner of the state title goes to Wichita, Kan., to compete for national honors.

## Cornelius and Gaston Garner Exhibition Wins

Gaston and Cornelius were victorious in exhibition baseball games over Tualatin valley league rivals as part of the "Happy Days" celebration on Wednesday and Thursday before good sized crowds.

Gaston rolled over three runs in the first of the ninth inning of the July 3 game to defeat Verboort, 4 to 3, and partially avenge two previous league defeats suffered at the hands of Verboort.

Cornelius came from behind to win by a similar score over Forest Grove before a large Fourth of July crowd. The rivalry had broken even in two previous Tualatin valley league contests.

A two-run double by Bob Morschosen proved to be the winning margin of the Gaston-Verboort game. The rivals were tied at one-all going into the first of the ninth, Verboort having scored once in the first, and Gaston having evened the count in the fourth frame. Lefty Jack Robinson went the route on the mound for Gaston, weathering a last-of-the-ninth rally by Verboort which pushed over two tallies.

Forest Grove took the lead over Cornelius with two runs in the first of the fifth. The winners came back with one tally in the last half of the inning and pushed over the three deciding runs in the last of the seventh.
