Meier Cow Sets World Record

MCKINLEY-BUMONICA—Brown Swiss cow, Arthur Rose Barrette's Blossom, owned by Albert Meier and son, has completed a junior two-year-old world record of 823 pounds of butter fat in 365 days, on two time milking a picnic dinner at Multnomah Falls on the Fourth of July.

She is a direct descendant of the first Brown Swiss cow purchased by John Meier Sr. about 35 years ago. This is the second world's record made by a Meier cow in the past year.

Albert Meier and son have sold two cows and a bull to the vice-president of the San Diego County Dairymen's association, Mr. Cooper. He is one of the leading dairymen of Southern California. He and his wife visited the Meiers for two days and hauled the animals home in their own truck.

The bull he purchased was the proven sire, "Emma's Show Boy" of Arthur Rose 42837, with a production index of 12,666 pounds of butter fat, 44 per cent test and 555 pounds of fat.
